Remember that when accessing one of the overflow positions you first make arrangements with the marina followed by marking the RHYC sign in sheet as soon as possible. It is certainly possible that you may arrive in between the time of someone signing in with the marina and the time it takes for them to access the book. In the case where 2 vessels arrive into the slip and plan for a two day stay followed by a third vessel taking the OFO, the 4th vessel may sign in on the waitlist with the expectation of getting the OFO the next day. I would recommend that this 4th vessel make contact with the marina staff that they will be waiting for the OFO to become available (which may be the next day) and also try to make a connection with the current OFO vessel to make time arrangements for the exchange. You **MUST** remain in the immediate marina vicinity for any waitlist access.

I would still appreciate any notes you have time to send me relating to use of any of our reciprocal club facilities. Without these notes, I have no way of knowing how much value we receive as a club for keeping up these agreements.



Galley Gourmet

This Award WINNING Recipe is from our Infamous Chili Cook-Off at Pleasant Harbor won by Kim Nance

HEARTY LOGGER'S CHILI – I doubled this recipe for the big pot at the RHYC Chili Fest
Kim Nance

1 pound ground beef (I used extra lean)
1 pound Kielbasa Beef Sausage (I have also used Kielbasa Turkey Sausage and it is terrific)
1 onion – chopped
1 red bell pepper – chopped (I like to use combo of red and yellow and orange peppers for some color)
2 garlic cloves, or more – chopped fine
1 16 oz. can of kidney beans, drained and rinsed
1 16 oz. can of black beans, drained and rinsed
1 16 oz. can of diced tomatoes
1 16 oz. can of tomato sauce
2 bay leaves
1 tsp salt
1-2 tsp chili powder (I use Hot Mexican Style Chili Powder)
1 tsp oregano (powdered is fine or fresh)
1 tsp of black pepper
½ - 3 tsp of cayenne pepper or Red Tabasco Sauce.
(Regarding the spices, do as this recipe says, start at the low end and then add amounts to your preferred taste)

Saute the ground beef in a large soup pot. Drain and set aside. Cut sausage into ½ inch slices and then cut each slice in half. Saute in the same pot until lightly browned and remove from pot, set aside BUT keep sausage drippings in pot. Saute onions and red/yellow/orange peppers till soft but not browned in the sausage drippings, adding a bit of olive oil if needed. Add garlic and sauté 2 more minutes. Add back the beef, sausage and remaining ingredients to pot and simmer, uncovered, for 1 hour or more on low. Serve with Sour Cream and shredded cheddar cheese.

This Chili is super thick, so I sometimes add an extra can of tomato sauce and diced tomatoes to thin a bit. It freezes really well and doubles easily.




