Vice Commodore's Report

Thank you for entrusting me with the position of Vice Commodore for the 2018 boating season. I look forward to a busy and fun filled year of boating fun. I need your help, as does the rest of the board. It was with great hesitancy that we voted to raise our dues but with our membership staying static at about 130 members for the last several years and our expenses increasing, we simply do not have enough funds to meet the financial obligations of the club. If we want to keep our four great outstations and maintain the club at its current great status we need to make sure we have adequate operating funds. One way we can do that is by recruiting and getting our numbers back up to 150 to 160 members. It's my job to encourage recruitment and to bring in more members. I challenge each of you to take a handful of our brochures and next time you are at a dock, recruit. Talk to your neighbors, find those new boaters who have kids or are new to boating and encourage them to join our club. Fly your burgee and wear our club attire. People always ask what the burgee on my ball cap represents so it's a good way to start a conversation. If we get enough new members we may be able to reduce the dues back to a lower rate.

I need a fleet captain for when I am commodore in 2019. According to our by laws the Fleet captain is named by the Vice Commodore a year prior to assuming to role of Commodore. That is so the incoming fleet captain is involved in setting up the cruise schedule for their year of service. If you have interest in being my fleet captain let me know. I did it twice and found it to be a fun and not overly complicated role to fill.

Now for some old business. At the COB I was asked to include in the next Anchor watch the Outstation use numbers.

The first number is the number of nights the outstation was used the second the number of members who used the outstation. I reported in error at the meeting. The numbers I reported for Roche OS were in fact the numbers for the Lopez outstation. I do not yet have access to the actual sign in logs for Roche this year but as soon as we have them we will update this chart.

The evening started with the business meeting. During my presentation, I discussed the need for a dues increase as the club had a loss in FY 16/17 as well as the previous two years. A \$50 increase for active members was recommended by the board and this proposed increase was published in the October dinghy watch at least ten days before the meeting.

During the discussion, Glen Dodge amended the recommendation to be an eighty-dollar increase for active members. A \$50 increase would still have the club operating at a loss whereas an \$80 increase would show a projected break even for the club. There was a vote to amend the motion from \$50 to \$80 and the vote passed. Tom Miner made a motion to increase active dues by \$80 and Orit Hickman seconded the motion. The membership voted to increase active dues by \$80.
