Vice Commodore's Report

Happy New Year RHYC! Looking forward to a great year of boating and were getting off to a great start with renewals coming in at a good pace. As of February 6th, we have 168 members. Of those 156 have renewed their membership by paying their 2018 dues. We still have 12 members who have not responded to any of the three notices that have been sent out reminding all of the need to renew. So, if you have not yet paid your dues you have until Feb 28th to make the payment and avoid a \$50.00 late fee.

I need to make an apology on behalf of the Board. Our automated billing renewal system and payment process has been a frustration for many of you and I. Initially we had 60 members who did not get the original email notification telling them that it was time to renew. That was partly our fault and partly the system administrator's fault. I sent out a blast email to those folks but when they tried to pay the website told them that they did not owe anything and could not pay. Shortly after that the system problem was fixed and they suddenly received multiple automated system emails advising them they were late and owed late fees.

The second issue was a system problem that we cannot fix. There are three types of membership. Active, Senior and Associate with different associated rates for dues. There are two ways to pay, credit card and check. The credit card rate has 3% credit card fee added to the dues rate to help pay for the clubs costs for the credit card convenience. The problem starts when you pay by check and receive your receipt. The system does not seem to care how you pay, just that you paid and sends you a receipt for the full amount plus the CC fee. So members who paid \$380.00 got receipts for \$394.40. You can imagine that not being able to pay when

told you need to pay, paying and getting a receipt for a different value and or getting multiple notices that you are overdue when in fact you have already paid would be frustrating. It is frustrating to me having to take all those calls and I understand the confusion and frustration.

In response the Board has agreed to turn off the on-line billing feature for now. The Vice Commodore will send out a group email to those still owing dues for 2018. Our treasurer will then send out receipts with accurate amounts reflected, once she receives your check payment. The Vice Commodore will edit the emails going out to reflect the appropriate amount you owe based on the type of membership you are listed under.



Another issue occurred with people who are 65 and making the assumption that they can pay the Senior rate of \$190.00. Per our bylaws, Senior membership requires a vote of the board to approve a written request for Senior status. You must be 65 and have been a member for 15 years of continuous membership. Or if you were a past Commodore and age 65 with 10 years of continuous membership you would qualify for Senior status. Be patient with us, we are trying very hard to fix the website and its problems. I appreciate your continued support of the club and its board members.

It is with sadness that I report several longtime members have chosen to not renew their membership;

- ~Ed and Misti Allison dropped due to health reasons, preventing them from using their boat. They joined in 1987
- ~Chuck and Dorothy Cooper. They are no longer able to utilize the club benefits. They joined in 1983
- ~Dan and Raye Lohse. They have submitted a letter indicating their intent to not renew their membership. They will be missed as long time active members. They joined in 1994.

I am still in search of a Fleet Captain for 2019 when I become Commodore. I will be asking in the coming months so if you have any interest at all give me a call or drop me an email.

I want to shout out a job well done to all those who worked the clubs booth at the Seattle Boats Show and especially to Larry Cronin who set it up and organized it. We were able to sign up 15 new members as a result. That is far beyond our estimates hoping to sign up 5 new members was our goal.

Thank you to all who renewed their dues in a timely manner. It makes my job so much easier if I don't have to call and pester fellow club members to pay up.

Hello fellow RHYC members! It is amazing to think that we are already in 2018! Despite the cold and some wet days, our outstations are still seeing usage which is wonderful. There are so many lovely reasons to visit our outstations during the offseason. In Kingston during the holidays the marina was decorated with an amazing light display. Check out the Port of Kingston website for details on events throughout the year. A few reminders about outstation use:

During the winter season (October 1st-April 30th) the Port of Kingston has use of our outstation as it sees fit. That means that if you come into the marina please call ahead to the marina office to confirm that our slip is available. If it is not, the marina office will put you in a slip and the club will pay for it. IF you do get placed at our slip, you still need to sign in to our sign-in sheets. And NO RAFTING is allowed at the Port of Kingston.

At Dockstreet, in Tacoma, our code for the box is ALSO our code for the door that leads down to our outstation from the street level. For those who have never been to our outstation it is in a PRIME location, right near the Glass Museum. Tacoma is so much fun to visit now! There are tons of amazing restaurants and shops within a short walk from the marina. Also El Gaucho has a van that will pick up marina visitors to bring to their restaurant!

As a member of RHYC, it is your responsibility to make sure that you sign into the book that is located at each of our outstations. This is the only way the club is able to track usage. If we do not have an accurate count of member usage, it is hard to justify having an outstation at all. PLEASE remember to do this.


