



VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS

Vessel Safety Checks will once again be offered at our annual business meeting cruise in April at the Everett Marina. We will begin checking boats Saturday, 12 April, from 1000HRS till 1500 HRS or the start of the business meeting whichever comes first.

The VSC Decals awarded are the same ones that the Coast Guard Auxiliary awards, in fact it is part of the same program.

Items that most often typically cause a boat not to pass this check are: **out of date flares**; **inoperative running lights**; **inoperative horns and no copy "Navigation Rules" (boats 39.4' or greater) onboard.** Checking a boat takes approximately 20-30 minutes.

As in the past, boats will be checked on a first come first served basis. Please contact Harry Johnson at formrtiger@msn.com to get your boat on the roster or for any questions concerning the VSC program.
