Either no one had a grounding experience in 2014 or everyone kept their lips sealed.




## Good Mariner Award

There is also a question on the form that asks if you want 1 or 2 membership cards. We only send 1 card automatically with renewal unless you return the form with the request for 2. You can also request membership flyers to hand out to potential new RHYC members. As you know, the success of our club relies on our current members recruiting new members so please help us find good RHYC applicants. A special thanks to Liz Dodge and Frank Sherwood for their help in getting the annual dues statements out to all the members!

Recreational Boating Association of Washington (RBAW) is also handled thru our membership renewal. Holidays mean it is Candy time.

#### Fabulous Holiday Fudge

Kim Nance, in memory of Cheryl Boswell

- 3 Milk Chocolate Hershey Bars (7 oz size)
- 1 12 oz. Package semi sweet chocolate chips
- 2 cubes butter
- 1 can (12oz.) evaporated milk
- $2\frac{1}{2}$  cups miniature marshmallows
- 4 cups sugar
- 1 pound coarsely chopped walnuts (nice sized pieces), you can also use pecans.
- 2 teaspoons vanilla

Put chocolate bars, chocolate chips and butter in a large bowl. Cut into pieces and set aside.

In large pan cook sugar, evaporated milk and 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  cups marshmallows to a boil, stirring constantly. Cook for 7 minutes at a low boil, stirring constantly.

Remove from heat and add the chocolate and butter. Stir until shine is gone anywhere from 5-10 minutes. Your arm may fall off by the end of the stirring. Add vanilla & nuts.

Pour into buttered pan and refrigerate.

OPTIONAL RECIPE: If you like a rocky road type of fudge, add 1 ½ cup FROZEN miniature marshmallows at the very end when you add the vanilla and nuts. Just stir in, not to melt.

#### **Peppermint Oreo Bark**

2 (12oz) bags white chocolate morsels 1 (10 oz) bag Andes peppermint crunch baking chips 40 Hershey's candy cane kisses, unwrapped and cut into ¼'s 24 Oreo's, chopped into pieces

In a large microwave safe mixing bowl, add white morsels and heat at 30 second increments until they are melted. Stir between each interval and once melted stir until smooth. Sprinkle in peppermint pieces and stir until smooth.



Pour onto a jelly roll pan or large sided baking sheet. Spread until smooth and covering the pan. Sprinkle Oreo's and kisses on top. Lightly press into melted candy. Refrigerate for 20 minutes until set.

Rap pan on counter top to break apart, or use butter knife to break into pieces. Enjoy!

## Happy Holidays

#### Shrimp Martini Appetizer\*\*

Red Sauce (can be made days ahead)

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> C. Ketchup
1 Tbl. Tabasco
1 Tbl. Green Tabasco
2-3 Tbl. Lime Juice
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Tbl. Worscheshire
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Tbl. Cajun Hot Sauce – if you don't have, I substitute <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp or a little more of cayenne pepper
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cup Cold Water

I measure and put all ingredients into a jar so I can shake it well to mix. I often times double & triple the sauce and keep it in the refrigerator and use it as needed when I throw together the salsa.

#### Chunky Salsa

2 Cups Roma Tomatoes (seeded & chopped and well drained or paper towel & blotted)-

1 Cup large sweet Onion (Chopped)

1/2 Cup Cilantro (Chopped)

1-2 Avocados (Diced) (add just before serving, <u>along with</u> the juice of one whole lime)

1/2 -1 Jalapeno (Seeded & Chopped) depending on palate

1 ½ - 2 pounds lbs. Medium Shrimp (Cooked & Peeled, cut up). I love Costco's cooked/peeled/frozen shrimp, the 21-30 size bag. They are meaty and beautiful shrimp compared to Safeway's shrimp which seem water logged to me.) Again, make sure they are well drained after thawing and well blotted. You do not want a this salsa to be runny and watered down due to tomatoes and shrimp being water logged.

Combine all ingredients and add Red Sauce to just coat Chunky Salsa. very cute if served in Large Martini Glass with Whole Shrimp hanging off the edge. Serve with Frito Lay Scoops Tortilla Chips (I like the Jalapeno flavored Scoops) or also a great dish for a smaller group served on iceberg lettuce leaves as a salad.

This recipe doubles easily, truly a delicious appetizer for guests. It will keep in the refrigerator a couple of days also but understand the Avocado's will turn brown after the first day. So if I make a big batch, I will only use what I need of the Chunky Salsa the first day with avocado and then use the rest the next day with fresh avocado.

#### \*\* Shrimp & Scallop Martini Appetizer

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> to <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> pound of shrimp (cooked, peeled and cut up) <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> to <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> pound of scallops sautéed, cooled and cut up)

I was caught off guard recently and thought I had a good supply of frozen shrimp in the freezer only to find out I had about ½ pound of shrimp and a 2 pound bag of scallops. So, rather than go to the store-God forbid-I just thawed the shrimp and about ¾ of a pound of Scallops. The shrimp were cooked so they are ready to go but the scallops were raw. So once they thawed, I quickly sautéed them, let them cool and then cut up into chunks along with the Shrimp. It was FABULOUS and well received by all.
