

## **Burgees and Handbooks:**

We have burgee's of 3 sizes available. Take a look at your burgee and make sure it's not to sun or wind worn. If it is, let me know and I'll bring some burgee's with me at the next event. The smaller Burgee is \$25 and the Large is \$35. If your burgee is too small for your boat, now is the time to move up. If you are using the small burgee for your dinghy, depending on size of dinghy it is less expensive to by the burgee dinghy at \$10.
