## **K**ear Commodore's Report

We are just around the corner from cruising time. The next cruise is at Des Moines Marina and the first on the water cruise of the year. Hope everyone is planning on attending as the St Patty's cruise is always fun.

Changes are coming at our Kingston outstation. The marina contacted me last month and advised that our rent for the end tie was going to nearly double, rafting would no longer be allowed and no overhang into the fairway would be allowed. They wanted to offer us a slip, as available at a reduced rate in lieu of the end tie.

The board has decided that would not be a viable option to replace the end tie as it would only be available to members if the marina had space and it would be a slip which means many of our member's boats would not fit as the largest slip is 50 feet at Kingston.

I have advised Kingston that we wish to maintain our end tie regardless of the increase in cost. To replace the loss of the rafting option I have asked for the option of an overflow outstation. This would mean that if the outstation if full and there is space available club members would have an option of one night stay in the overflow outstation that would be paid for by the club.

This is a significant unanticipated increase in costs to the club and one that is not budgeted. Stay tuned for finale resolution to this issue. It is not yet resolved but as of this time we still have the outstation at Kingston but effective immediately there is no more rafting and no overhang allowed. At this time, we do not have an agreement for an overflow outstation so don't ask the marina until that is fully agreed to by all parties.

Additionally, Bellevue Yacht Club is in the same position. They have an end tie outstation next to ours and have had the same notice by the marina. Their Rear Commodore and I have been talking and discussing possible dual use and cost sharing. I have not heard back from them yet so have no idea if that would work for them. They use it about the same as we do, 50 user days per year. Sharing the cost would decrease our costs to less than what we pay

now. We will not consider this as an option if we do not get the overflow outstation agreement in place.

I have been looking at alternative locations. Poulsbo is not an option; their docks were built under a federal grant and earmarking any space for private use is not allowed. Edmonds is interested but we would pay even more there and still have no rafting or overhang allowance. Port Ludlow is an option in the future but not until they complete their expansion. Pt. Townsend has no end tie available and the rates would not be any cheaper. The bottom line is an outstation in mid sound is a great benefit but is a costly one.

Please feel free to send me your thoughts and suggestions on this issue as it affects all members in some way.

Chris and I worked the yacht club booth at the boat show this year and had a great time. We talked to a lot of people who are interested in joining a club and many were checking us out because they had heard great things about us. Over 50 people filled out interest cards during the boat show run and we will be inviting them to join us on a cruise sometime in the coming year. The board has decided to do it again next year so if you did not join us at this year's show make sure you sign up and staff the booth next year; it is a bunch of fun. The booth was designed by Larry Cronin and it was one of the nicest looking booths there. Just the club name starts the conversation so it's not hard to get people talking and showing an interest in who we are and what we do.

## Dunshine Report


