The Memorial Day Cruise at Pleasant Harbor Marina was a fun event with beautiful weather! There was a total of 12 boats with 36 people attending. Unfortunately, Driscoll's had a boat issue and had to attend by ferry instead of boat.

Everyone received a patriotic bandana to wear throughout the cruise as well as patriotic tootsie rolls and tootsie pops!

This was an interesting cruise – we had 3 prospective member boats – 3 qualifying cruise boats – and 6 member boats – we almost got outnumbered by new people! We were pleased to welcome Gail & Arnold Haberstroh, Tracy & Dan Averill, and Georgina & Joel Peterson to the club!

We enjoyed a pizza appetizer on the dock (made by the marina deli) on Friday night.

Vice Commodore's Report

Welcome to Summertime cruising! Well, at least it seems that way after the opening day and Memorial Day cruises. As we have all experienced a ton of rain for the past six months, it was great to have cruises where the sun put in a good showing.

Our Opening Day weather experience did not start out great as Holly needed to return to our anchored boat in the cut with the rest of the RHYC boats from Kirkland. When she was ready in the late afternoon on Thursday, the southern sky seemed to be filled with thunderstorms. Looking at the weather radar app, it looked like we had about an hour or so break before it hit so off I went to Kirkland across lake Washington as fast as our dingy would go. The nearer I got to the dock the worst the wind waves got and in a 12' dingy, they all look large. When I was finally able to get to the Kirkland dock, Holly jumped in and we headed back to the boat again as fast as the dingy would go. It was about then she turned to me and asked, "should we be out here?". Well the answer was of course a big "NO", but we were committed as the waves behind us were larger than the ones in front of us. The sky to the South over Bellevue was filled with one huge thunderhead with lightning on all sides and a large rain shadow heading our way. The next 60 mins was a lightshow of lightning strikes all around the line of boats with a beginning of a funnel cloud forming to the Northwest and moving east. It was then that Holly told me the local radio stations were strongly warning people to get off the lake due to the extreme weather, oops! Fortunately, it seemed that this storm cleared out the last vestige of bad weather as the rest of the opening day weekend was in a word, 'perfect'.

Rear Commodore Report

Another opening day is behind us and it turned out great. Chris and I were out on the boat for the week prior to Opening Day with our grandson River. We cruised north to check out the outstations at Kingston, Fisherman's Bay and Roche. All is in good order. The sign at Kingston was given a new facelift and I ordered new signs for Roche as they are in sad shape. I will get them up as soon as I can or as soon as I can find someone headed north. According to Marina Manager Kevin, the club is in good standing with them. He said he has had no issues with club members or the outstation for the last couple years, which was great news, so let's keep it that way.

The outstation signs at Fisherman's look great. The books are all updated with the new rules, new sign in sheets and I replaced the old rusted binders with newer ones at each station. I was surprised to find the Roche outstation and all of G dock full when I entered the harbor as the annual Seline Rendezvous was underway.

At the Business meeting I was tasked to look at options for monitoring the outstation use in a more efficient manner. I have looked into this and have found a remote camera that would work but the cost is prohibitive, as it requires a monthly outlay for a monitoring service. At this time we will continue to monitor the outstation use to see if there are ongoing issues that would warrant this expense.

We cruised back in time to enter the lake on Wednesday along with Dodges and Jim Wagenblast to claim our space on the Montlake Cut for Opening Day. We had to wait an hour to get into the locks because they were operating only half the big locks and only one wall. I ended up having to back out and wait for a second opening.

Weather was great Wednesday and Thursday until about 4 pm. Then those wicked thunder and lightening storms arrived as predicted. We are very fortunate that the high winds and heavy rains that Olympia and Lacey suffered did not materialize over us. I can only imagine what a 70 mph storm would have done to the hundreds of boats on the cut. It would not have been pretty. We managed to survive and Friday and Saturday were better than forecast. Cooler but the rain was minimal. Saturday was actually a very nice day for the parade. We had 15 boats rafted up interspersed with several Queen City YC boats. We are also in need of a Fleet Captain for next year. It is the one position on the Board that is appointed by the incoming Commodore. Jon Edwards is next years Commodore and has not had much luck recruiting. I have served in that position twice and it is not all that difficult of a job.
