Cruise Report - July 3rd Cruise



What a great July 3rd cruise! We had 19 boats register but only 15 showed up. We set the wheel Saturday and of course the wind blew making it a bit of a challenge. We were concerned we were close to the location for the fireworks barge but there were no marker buoys and the Poulsbo police cruised by and watched us set up and did not seem concerned. With only 12 boats arriving Saturday the wheel was more like two half circles with gaps in between. We all gathered on Georgina, a beautiful 64 Nordhaven owned by Joel and Georgina Peterson for appetizers. Weather was great, cloudy and cool in the mornings and sunny and hot each afternoon.

Sunday, we added the last 3 boats and came close to closing the wheel.

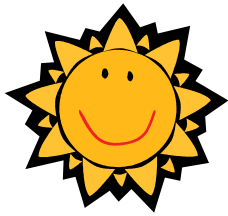


Fleet Captain's Report
