Hello everyone! I hope you all had a wonderful holiday season. Matt, Emerson and I spent it with family and it was really relaxing. I wanted to spend this report going through the process that each new member goes through. I thought that this would be important because we are going into the Boat Show season and many of you

will be talking to perspective members. The more you know the more you can sell the club! As a reminder we are a cruising club, so we have 4 outstations, many reciprocals and monthly club events that everyone can participate in—either by boat or by land yacht!

The process for a new member is as follows

The new member applies for membership on the website rhyc.org and pays the application fee of \$400. This fee covers the cost of getting a login on the website, burgee, nametags and roster.

I then contact them by email or phone to connect with them. I want to talk to them, ideally, get to know them and learn about them.

They then get published in the AW as a 'new active applicant'

Then they need to go on a cruise! This is their chance to meet all of us and the board's chance to meet them. This is important because the board then needs to vote on them to officially make them new members and we can't do that if we haven't met them!

I then assign pro-rata dues. For those that join us at the boat show we waive these for the first year. New members who join at the boat show only have to pay the application fee.

Once they have been voted in, they are then officially members. They will get all of their new SWAG at the next cruise they go on and a photo is taken of them with their burgee and put in the next AW so we can all welcome them officially when we meet them out on the Salish Sea!

As members it is important that we understand these steps ALL need to take place for a new member to then get their membership card and burgee. ALSO when you talk to perspective members it is important to stress that within the first 2 years of membership it is expected that they participate in a cruise as a team member then volunteer to be a cruise captain. Our strength as a club is in our active participation in our cruises. Every time I participate in a cruise, I meet new people and it strengthens my bond to this club! ## Treasurer's Report

Hello everyone. The membership renewal process is in full swing. Dues renewal notices went out in November, a second notice in December, followed by a third and final notice in January 2019. The membership renewals are due by **January 31** and a late fee of \$50 will be assessed for renewals not received by January 31. You can pay dues either on the website or you can mail in a check. If you pay on the website there is a 3% Credit card fee that is assessed. If you choose to pay by check please mail your check to:

There has been some confusion with people mailing in checks – remember that you only pay the dues amount -not the amount that is shown on the website which is for credit card payments. To summarize:

Regular Active Members	\$380 by check	\$391.40 by credit card
Senior Members	\$190 by check	\$195.70 by credit card
Associate Members	\$100 by check	\$103.00 by credit card

For those paying by check, your cancelled check is your receipt of payment. As many remember from last year the Club Express system can only handle one bill amount per membership class so we set up the amount due by credit card payments. I handle the change in payment when I receive your check but the only receipt that can be issued by the system automatically is for the Credit Card payment amount. Rather than send you incorrect information, we are not sending a receipt, so your cancelled check is your receipt of payment.

IMPORTANT NOTE: \*\*\*\*\*\* It is really important that everyone go into their membership record and verify that the information we have on Club Express is correct. This is the opportunity for you to update addresses, emails, boat and boat information in addition to telephone numbers. The information that we have online is the information that will printed in the new roster. For those that renewed by check, many did not go into the Club express system to review and renew your membership – you just mailed me a check. PLEASE login to the system and verify that all the information we have for you is correct. To verify or update your information:

Go to rhyc.clubexpress.com. Click on Member Login in the upper right corner and login. Once you have logged in, you will see your name and a down arrow in the upper right corner of the page. Highlight the down arrow and select the 2<sup>nd</sup> item – My Directory information. You can change any information that is not correct by clicking on the pencil to the right of each section.

Remember to go to the bottom of the page and SAVE your changes.
