## Rear Commodore's Report

Hello RHYC! Are you gearing up for the upcoming cruising season? We have been busy getting Run-A-Muk ready to head to Kingston for the Saint Paddy's Cruise. The Sackett kids have been hard at work planning out the festive boat decor and green outfits. Keep your Irish eyes peeled for us as we pull in to port.

We have many new members that will be joining in the cruising fun in the coming months, so I thought I'd take a moment to review our Outstation protocols. If you have any questions, shoot me an email!

#### Roche Harbor Outstation:

The yacht club has an agreement with the marina that guarantees two slips every night for club members. Call the marina upon entering the harbor for slip assignment. First come first serve. Stay is limited to 2 nights out of any 14-day period. The Marina will track your stay so there is no longer a need to register in the log book.

#### Kingston Outstation:

May 1st-September 30th our outstation is 80' of side tie located on the end of dock D. Please register in the log book as soon as you arrive (lock box code is 1987). Stay is limited to 3 nights out any 7-day period. During the off season of October 1st- April 30th, please contact the port directly for directions on where to dock.

#### Fisherman's Bay Outstation:

This outstation is 90' of side tie plus 15' of overhang located on the east end of the South walkway dock. Rafting is mandatory up to 6 boats from dock. Please register in the log book as soon as you arrive (lock box code is 1987). Stay is limited to 2 nights out of any 7 day period.

#### **Dockstreet Outstation:**

This outstation is a 60' slip located at F 10 of Dockstreet, Foss Waterway. Please register in the log book as soon as you arrive (lock box code is 1987). Stay is limited to 2 nights out of any 7-day period.

If you visit one of our outstations and notice something that needs attention, please let me know! I plan to refresh our log books and check on the condition of our lock boxes before the April Business Meeting.

## Treasurer's Report

We are finalizing the membership renewals for 2019 in preparation for the annual members book. The Roster is produced using the information that is on the RHYC website, so it is important that you review your information to make sure the information we have is correct. Have you changed your phone numbers, moved or changed boats? If you did not review your information when you renewed your membership it is important that you do that now if you want the correct information published in the book.

The annual tax return for the RHYC was filed in January 2019. We are a Social club and exempt from federal income tax as described in IRC 501(c)(7) since we are "organized for pleasure, recreation, and other non-profitable purposes." We are still required to file a tax return which is due by March 15 since our club operates on a fiscal year that goes from November 1 – October 31 each year.

The financial statements have been reconciled thru January 31 and presented to the board at our monthly meeting on February 5. As part of the preparation of the financial statements, our bank account with US Bank has been reconciled. The financial statements

will be available in addition to a presentation of our budget at the annual meeting on April 13<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 in Gig Harbor (The Academy@the Boatyard). Be sure to get signed up for the cruise portion of the weekend as soon as possible. The moorage is a bit more complicated as we will be using Arabella's and the City dock. If you are not able to come to the weekend cruise but are planning on attending the business meeting you are also able to sign up and attend the dinner that evening. The meal is being catered so we need to have a final count of meals by March 27. The cost of the meal is \$35. There is information in the cruise flyer on the website about the meal being served. Since the signup on the website is for the cruise, you must email me at treasurer@rhyc.org if you would like to attend the dinner only.

The expensive lesson we learned from this episode is to rotate out our boat's high stress lines instead of relying on them year after year.


