
Thanks to Glen there is now a forum section on the website. I just added a section on Electrical issues on boats and I see someone posted a question on next years schedule. This is a great new addition so jump on board, start a thread, share information, share your summer plans and other fun or educational stuff with the rest of us.

Don't forget you can join our facebook page and post photos of your great adventures and share your summer plans there as well. It is a closed member only page so you have to request to join and someone on the board will approve your joining it.

We will begin looking for an additional virtual outstation that we pay for on an as used basis only. We will look at our current budget and see what that will look like but remember, if we bring on more new members our budget increases so we can do more without having to use any of our investment funds. We will generate a proposal and send it out to membership hopefully in the very near future. It all depends on finding a marina that is willing and able to have us, the cost and the club's available funds. Remember, the board can never spend more than \$5,000 of the investment fund in any fiscal year, without membership approval. Our investment committee thinks that if we limit any use of that fund to the annual, investment interest earned, maintaining the current principal, we should have a decent amount of money to use towards an additional outstation if needed and maintain our current investment value. Feel free to weigh in on the website forum. Be nice.

Electrical power cord warning.

I went to plug into the pedestal at Arabella's this past weekend with my 30 amp plug. This is what I saw.



Not much, just some minor brown scorching on the middle and upper prongs. Decided I needed to take it apart and clean the contacts and maybe peel back the wire to cut out any corrosion.

This is what I found.






Melted, bubbled up plastic around two wire connectors and two wires fused together, meaning there was lots of heat at some point leading to total failure in the near future.

Make sure you are checking your shore power cord every time you use it and keep the prongs clean of corrosion. If you see burning of any kind the cord got too hot and needs to be replaced. Corrosion is insidious in our saltwater environment. Only use heat shrink connectors when wiring new connections and only use proper sized, tinned, marine grade wiring. Shortcuts and doing it cheap when it involves electrical is not an option on a boat. For good information on Electrical connections visit Pacific Yacht Systems.
