
It has been a great year with lots of fun cruising and fantastic events. Thanks to everyone who volunteered as cruise teams, worked the boat show booth, and helped make things happen which is why this is such a great yacht club. And I owe my fabulous board members a huge thank you for all that they have done this year. They have made my job as Commodore very enjoyable. We still need people who are willing to take on the role of running this club. We still do not have a secretary for the 2020 board of trustees. It's not a difficult job and the rest of the board is willing to help out whoever steps up to fill the spot. As past commodore in 2020 I will be responsible for filling vacant positions of treasurer, secretary and rear commodore for 2021. Please, we need members to step up and assume the positions on the board to keep the good times rolling. We are all busy, it only takes a couple hours once a month for phone in board meetings and it is a great way to make new friends and really get to know the other members in the club.

I just had an opportunity to import a boat from British Columbia to Washington for my daughter and son in law. Thought I would share what we learned so if any of you ever plan on buying a boat in BC and bringing it here there is definitely a process you must follow.

- 1. First, do your homework and plan the import, do not just show up at customs expecting to breeze through the process. Won't happen.
- 2. Contact Customs and Boarder Patrol ahead of time and they will send you an email with all the requirements for importation of a vessel.
- 3. Download the two federal forms they require and fill them out. Return them to the customs office where you plan on crossing back into the US. They will set up a file for when you arrive with the boat. (Friday Harbor is the preferred entry point from BC)
- 4. If it is a private sale without a broker get a bill of sale from the seller.
- 5. Make sure if there are two names on the vessel registration / title that both of those owners sign the bill of sale.
- 6. Make sure you have original copies of registration, signed over by previous owners and an original bill of sale.
- 7. Obtain a photocopy of a government document such as a Drivers license from the sellers

- with their signature visible on it. This is so CBP has something legal to compare the seller's signature on the bill of sale with.
- 8. Make sure everything on the bill of sale is spelled correctly and matches the registration
- 9. If the boat was built in the US there will be no duty. If built elsewhere there may be a duty so they need the actual value of the boat. (We had a value from the recent survey)
- 10. Take a photo of the HIN on the back transom of the boat
- 11. You must schedule your crossing time and place.
- 12. It must be between 9 and 5 on a weekday. CBP does not do imports on weekends.
- 13. New Owner must be on the boat.
- 14. Be patient.

Our last Cruise of the year will be to Kingston for their Christmas Lights extravaganza. This is a very wonderful show and you can also sign up for this on the website as well.


Again, it has been my pleasure to be your 2019 Fleet Captain and I hope to see all of you on a cruise in the near future.
