IMPORTANT NOTE:****** It is really important that everyone go into their membership record and verify that the information we have on Club Express is correct. This is the opportunity for you to update addresses, emails, boat and boat information in addition to telephone numbers. The information that we have online is the information that will be printed in the new roster. For those that renewed by check, many did not go into the Club express system to review and renew your membership – you just mailed me a check. PLEASE login to the system and verify that all the information we have for you is correct.

To verify or update your information: Go to rhyc.clubexpress.com. Click on Member Login in the upper right corner and login. Once you have logged in, you will see your name and a down arrow in the upper right corner of the page. Highlight the down arrow and select the 2nd item – My Directory information.

You can change any information that is not correct by clicking on the pencil to the right of each section. Remember to go to the bottom of the page and SAVE your changes. All members need to login and correct the information. The system has a separate membership record for the primary and secondary members so changing it in one profile does not change it in the other. Please change both records.

The Audit for the 2018-2019 fiscal year that ended October 31, 2019 was conducted by Steve Driscoll and Glen Dodge. The review included board minutes, expenditures, bank statements, check register, reconciliation statements, Vanguard statements, club data base, use of the website as payments platform and the adequacy of the accounting system. The Thanksgiving and Christmas Lights cruises were well attended and a fun time was had by all! Thanks to everyone that made this a great cruising year and I'm looking forward to 2020 with new adventures and destinations. Please check out our website and sign up for the Icebreaker Cruise and Sweetheart Cruise if you haven't already!

I'm still looking for a Cruise team for the Father's Day cruise at Port Ludlow, and we could use a few volunteers to help with upcoming cruises later this year.

Now that winter weather has curtailed some of our cruising days, I would like to update you on a few procedures for Canadian and US Customs that will make your border crossings less stressful. I know there are members heading to Alaska, and quite a few will be crossing into Canada after the Colors Cruise in August.

For those of you not familiar, if your boat is over 30 Feet in length (which is most of us), you are required to regis-

ter and purchase a "Private Vessel Decal" Yearly - for re-entering the US from Canada.

Decals are stickers that are placed on all private aircraft and private vessels (30 feet or more in length) as proof that the User Fee for entry into the U.S. has been paid for the calendar year. Any arriving vessel or aircraft that does not have an annual decal will be required to pay the non-refundable User Fee and complete an application, which will be forwarded to the processing center. The application will be processed, and a decal will be mailed from the processing center. A decal expires on December 31st of its issue year. A new decal is issued whenever the decal is renewed.

Here is a link to the Government site where you can Register, apply for the Decal, and Pay. The Decal will be mailed to you and must be affixed to your boat. https://dtops.cbp.dhs.gov/main/#%20 I would also highly recommend you apply for a Nexus Card (\$50) to expedite your entry into Canada. Nexus is good for 5 years and is good at airports, Automobile Border Crossings, and Marine Ports of Entry.

"The NEXUS program allows pre-screened travelers expedited processing when entering the United States and Canada. Program members use dedicated processing lanes at designated northern border ports of entry, NEXUS kiosks when entering Canada by air and Global Entry kiosks when entering the United States via Canadian Preclearance airports. NEXUS members also receive expedited processing at marine reporting locations."

Next newsletter I will update you on the CBP Roam App and how it can impact your travel returning to the US from Canada.


