I read a really wonderful article the other day that put things in perspective for me. Some of you have probably seen this floating around social media but I will summarize it here.

Imagine you were born in 1900. On your 14th birthday WWI starts and ends on your 18th birthday. 22 million people die in this war. Later that same year the Spanish flu epidemic hits and continues until you are 20 years old. 50 million people died because of the Spanish flu.

When you are 29 the Great Depression begins. This runs until you are 33. Unemployment hits 25% and the World GDP drops 27%.

You are barely 39 when World War II starts and the US joins the war when you are 41 years old. The war continues until you are 45 and 77 million people perish in this war.

When you are 50 the Korean War starts and 5 million people die. From your birth until 55 years old you dealt with fear of polio each summer.

At 55 years old the Vietnam War begins and continues until you are 75. 4 million people perish in this war. In the middle of this the Cold War is happening, and you live with the fear of nuclear attack. On your 62nd birthday the Cuban Missile Crisis occurred, and life almost ended for the planet.

I was born in 1975—the last year of the Vietnam War. In my lifetime I have lived through several wars—none of which have occurred on our soil, I lived through the 9/11 attacks and now I am living through a pandemic. Prior to reading the above article, I wavered between being mad and being really sad about all that is going on right now. After reading the article I found some peace. As a healthcare provider I could worry every day about my risk or simply live knowing that I have done all that I can do. When I connect with another human being, I feel joy and peace. Right now, that is the most important thing that any of us can be doing—connecting. With each other, our friends, and our families. Boating brings us together and we can still do that this year. Sure, it looks different than years past, but it is still boating. And we are still doing it in one of the most beautiful places in the world.


