
## Commodore Report

We met two friends at the border who had a chair on each side and were sitting there having a visit. They let us know that many Canadians have property in the town and have not been able to get to their homes. This was evident by the many lawns that were overgrown. Despite the lack of humans, we did hike a bunch and visit 3 of the 4 parks that the town is known for. We also got takeout lunch at the one open café and it was delicious. Matt and I discussed coming back after the border is open to see how different the town might be. Overall, we really enjoyed our visit. I know many of you took different trips this summer—some went South Sound, and some did a lot of exploring in the San Juans. No matter where you went and what you did, I hope that you were able to relax and enjoy the beautiful boating opportunities that we are fortunate to have here in the PNW!

On a business note, our annual business meeting has been moved to later in September. It will be on Saturday, September 19<sup>th</sup> at 2pm. It will be a zoom meeting. We will be covering many important topics. Please stay tuned for a dinghy watch to come out right after this AW. 




