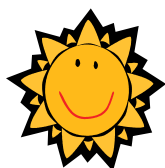
Past Commodore

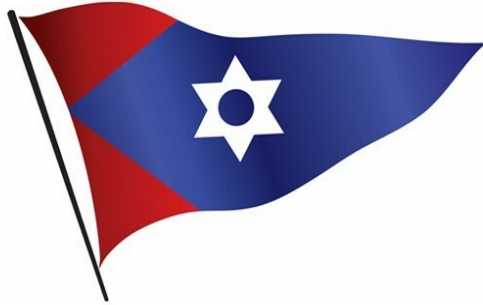
